Dear friends,

The John Tyler Community College Foundation is rooted in the belief that education can transform a community. Our goal is to foster partnerships between the College and business and industry leaders, as well as to ensure that members of our community have access to high-quality, affordable education.

Our work is vital when you consider that by 2018, 64% of jobs in Virginia will require education and/or training beyond high school.

Notable achievements from the year include:

- Total net assets for the Foundation surpassed the \$6,000,000 mark.
- The Foundation awarded more than \$192,000 in scholarships directly to 125 local students, many of whom could not have attended college without financial help.
- The Dr. Marshall W. Smith Endowed Scholarship was established through individual gifts honoring Smith's 23 years of outstanding leadership as president of John Tyler Community College.
- Corporate donors funded scholarships; career coaches in middle and high schools; the Great Expectations program for youth transitioning out of foster care; as well as academic programming and equipment needs.
- Phase III of the Midlothian Campus was approved by the General Assembly. The highlight of Phase III is a new 70,000-square-foot Academic Building that will feature specialized spaces for engineering and technology courses, as well as a black box teaching theatre that will be used for community events.

On behalf of the John Tyler Community College Foundation Board, I want to thank you for your investment in the Foundation in 2013 and look forward to your continued support in 2014. Together, we are improving the quality of life and the economy of our local community.

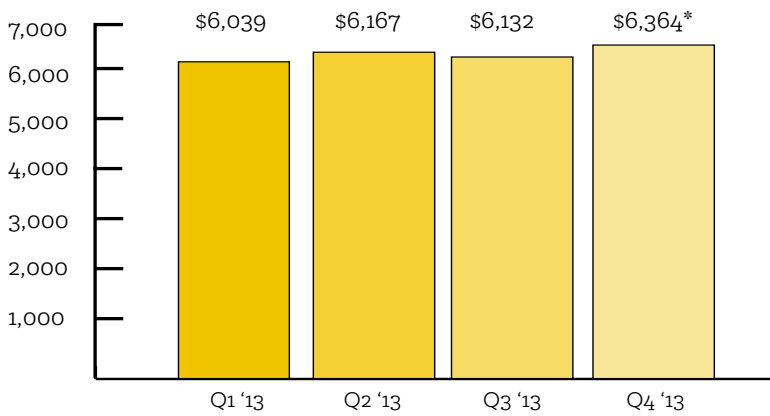
## Net assets

Net assets at end of year (2013): \$6,598,888

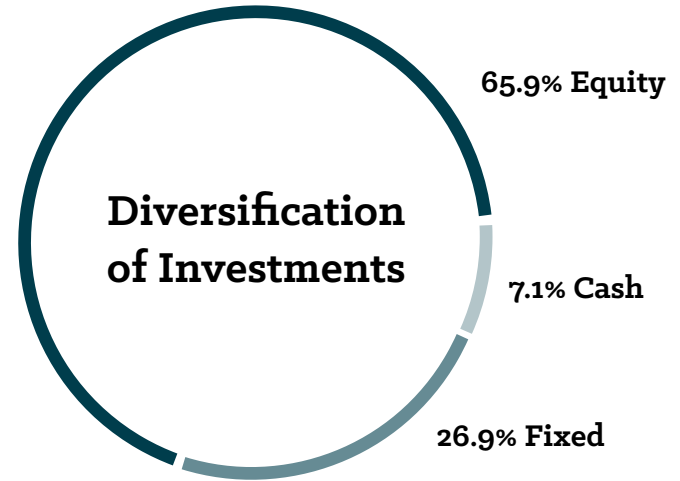

(in thousands)

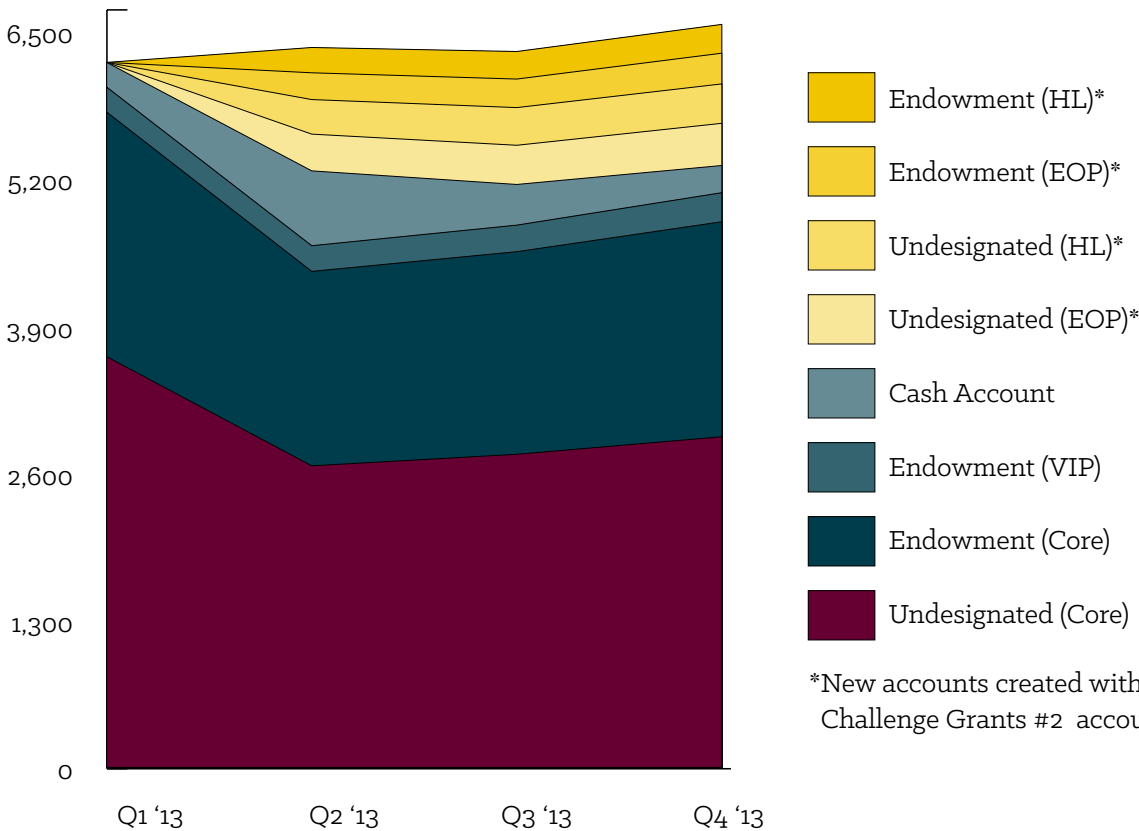


\*Net withdrawals of \$528,535 in 2013.

## Huneke Earns Second Foundation Art Award

Light and shadow play across the canvas, bringing rich colors and bold textures to life. A woman sits quietly, gazing into the distance. Her thoughts are unknown. This is *Tory* painted by Alexander William Huneke, and it is the winning artwork in the annual John Tyler Community College Foundation Art Award contest. This is the second time Huneke's work has received this honor. Last year, his entry, *After Picasso, "Woman with Pears" (sans Pears)*, became the first 3-D sculpture to win the Foundation Art Award.

The announcement of the 2014 Foundation Art Award winner came as Huneke was finishing up his classes at John Tyler. At the end of the Fall 2013 semester, he was awarded an Associate of Applied Arts Degree in Visual Arts and a Certificate of Fine Arts. He is now continuing his education at Virginia Commonwealth University.

The John Tyler Community College Foundation Art Award started in 1995 to showcase the artistic abilities of John Tyler's students while providing donors with a unique gift from the College.

## HCA Virginia Chippenham and Johnston-Willis Hospitals Honored with 2013 Philanthropy Award

HCA Virginia Chippenham and Johnston-Willis Hospitals were honored with the 2013 Chancellor's Award for Leadership in Philanthropy.

Over the years, HCA Virginia Chippenham and Johnston-Willis Hospitals have generously supported John Tyler Community College in numerous ways. In 2006, they provided building space to the College's Nursing Program, allowing the program to move to one location and to expand. The hospitals also support the John Tyler Community College Foundation's scholarship program, giving students the financial assistance needed to continue their educations. And, HCA Virginia Chippenham and Johnston-Willis Hospitals provide educational resources to students in the College's Nursing Program.

Tim McManus, chief operating officer for the hospitals and a member of the John Tyler Community College Foundation Board, accepted the Award for Leadership in Philanthropy on behalf of the hospitals. McManus and Trula Minton, chief nursing officer for the hospitals, called community colleges a "vital link for people to receive excellent training," adding, "We contribute as part of our mission to be a source of education and clinical education for nurses and other health professionals, which is an important part of our partnership with community colleges."

The Chancellor's Award for Leadership in Philanthropy luncheon is hosted by the Virginia Foundation for Community College Education (VFCCE) to honor the leading philanthropists from each of Virginia's 23 community colleges as well as the statewide foundation. 2013 marked the eighth year the awards were given. The 2013 class of distinguished philanthropy leaders contributed a combined total of more than \$17 million dollars to Virginia's Community Colleges.

## Mother. Student. Advocate. Scholarship Recipient.

Jennifer Silva wants to teach you three words: tuberous sclerosis complex. If you're like most people, you've never heard of this medical condition, also known as TSC. Silva, too, was unaware of this disease until her son, Jared, was diagnosed with TSC when he was 18-months-old, nine months after he suffered his first seizure.

TSC is a disease that causes tumor growths in organs such as the heart, brain, lungs, kidneys and skin. In Jared's case, TSC has caused three brain tumors, and because of them, he suffers from seizures as well as learning and behavioral problems. TSC is considered rare, but Jennifer says more and more people are being diagnosed with it. So, in addition to caring for her son, Silva is taking steps to raise awareness of and funds for TSC, and she's doing all of this while studying to become a nurse at John Tyler Community College.

For a time, Silva put aside a lifelong dream of becoming a nurse to focus on Jared's care, but she didn't turn her back on medicine. She took a job at a veterinary clinic and worked there for seven years before concluding that she really wanted to work with humans. That's when she turned to John Tyler Community College.

Silva entered the Nursing Program's hybrid track, which gave her the flexibility to juggle coursework and responsibilities at home. A scholarship from the John Tyler Community College Foundation also helped make College financially possible.

Silva plans to graduate from Tyler in December 2014. She hopes to earn a bachelor's and master's degree and to one day use her skills to teach or to work in a clinic that specializes in the care of TSC patients.

In the meantime, Silva continues to advocate for TSC awareness and research. She is currently chair of Tuberous Sclerosis Alliance of Virginia and works closely with those who are newly diagnosed with TSC. This past spring, she and Jared, who is now 11, traveled to Washington, D.C. to meet with members of Virginia's Congressional delegation to discuss the need to continue funding a grant that supports the Tuberous Sclerosis Complex Research Program.

## Tyler Names Seventh President

Dr. Edward “Ted” Raspiller joined John Tyler Community College in August 2013, becoming its seventh president. Dr. Raspiller arrived at Tyler with more than two decades of experience in higher education that includes roles in college leadership and administration, teaching, workforce development, fundraising, and counseling.

Dr. Raspiller outlined four strategic initiatives to guide his early work at the College: strategic enrollment management; reaching out to underserved populations across the service region; strategic planning and assessment; and professional development.

“Education is a transformative experience for the students who come here,” Raspiller says. “And, I want John Tyler to be a lifelong learning partner for every business, every individual in our service area.”
